**Name of Community Council: Llandysiliogogo Community Council**

**Introduction**

Llandysiliogogo is a small Community Council (CC) in Ceredigion, with a precept of £ 10,267.92 (financial year 2022/23). There are **855** residents on the electoral role in the villages of Talgarreg, Caerwedros, Nanternis and Cwmtudy.

Most the Community Council's influence on biodiversity will be through observations provided during consideration of planning application at our Community Council meetings. This will ensure the promotion and protection of the eco-system with the Community. If biodiversity opportunities are identified we will seek to work closely with Ceredigion County Council to identify biodiversity on public and community spaces.

### Review of s6 duty

- **What has worked well?**

Grass and Hedgerows have been cut in accordance with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 that prohibits the destruction or disturbance of nesting birds.

Ceredigion County Council and landowners have also allowed grass to grow to encourage wildflowers and insect species, this is welcomed by Llandysiliogogo Community Council, if the land does not obstruct the highway.

- **What have the barriers been?**

Llandysiliogogo Community Council do not own land, therefore are only able to comment and encourage landowners and stakeholders to be influenced by biodiversity.

- **What will you change?**

Continue to progress as previously stated Llandysiliogogo Community Council do not own land but encourage landowners/stakeholders to plant wild flowers etc

- **How and when will the s6 duty be monitored and the s6 plan reviewed?**

S6 will monitored by all Councillors as they are able to report on issues that arise in the Ward to the Clerk or County Councillor. The plan will be reviewed annually and reviewed in accordance with amended legislation.
